

## **Kenneth R. Feinberg, Independent Claims Administrator, Independent Reconciliation and Reparations Program**



Kenneth R. Feinberg and his colleague, Camille Biros, are nationally-recognized experts in the design, implementation and administration of public and private compensation programs going back to the Agent Orange Vietnam Veterans Compensation Program in 1986. He has administered numerous high-profile compensation programs, having served as Special Master of the September 11<sup>th</sup> Victim Compensation Fund, TARP Executive Compensation, and the Gulf Coast Claims Facility, among many more.

Along with the Independent Reconciliation and Reparations Program for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, Feinberg currently serves alongside his colleague, Camille Biros, as Fund Administrator for the New York Archdiocese Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program and the Fund Administrator for the Brooklyn Diocese and Rockville Centre Diocese Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Programs, at the request of Cardinal Timothy Dolan.

Mr. Feinberg has served in a *pro bono* capacity as Administrator for the OneOrlando Fund, designing and implementing a claims program for the distribution of over \$25 million in corporate and private donations to the victims of the Pulse Nightclub shooting in Orlando in June 2016. Mr. Feinberg has also served in a *pro bono* capacity as Fund Administrator for the One Fund Boston Victim Relief Fund, Advisor for the Newtown-Sandy Hook Victim Compensation Fund, Administrator of the Aurora Victim Relief Fund following the Colorado movie theater shooting in 2012, and Administrator of the Hokie Spirit Memorial Fund following the shootings at Virginia Tech University in 2007.

Mr. Feinberg was appointed by the Obama Administration and BP in 2010 to serve as Administrator of the Gulf Coast Claims Facility to compensate victims of the BP Deepwater Horizon oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico.

In November 2001, Attorney General John Ashcroft appointed Mr. Feinberg to serve as Special Master of the September 11<sup>th</sup> Victim Compensation Fund. In this capacity, Mr. Feinberg developed and promulgated the Regulations governing the Fund's administration and oversaw the evaluation of applications, determination of appropriate compensation, and dissemination of awards totaling \$7 billion.
